1. Balcony House Ruin, Mesa Verde National Park, Colorado. “Then as now, ladders and crawl spaces provided the only access to Balcony House, high in the wall of Soda Canyon.”
2. Casa Rinconada, Chaco Culture Historical Park, New Mexico. “The largest of the great kivas at the site, Casa Rinconada may have served as a center for the entire Chacoan community.”
3. Chimney Rock ruins, Chacoan culture, San Juan Mountains, San Juan National Forest, Colorado.
4. Jornada-Style Petroglyph Panel, Three Rivers, New Mexico. “Between A.D. 900 and 1400 the Jornada Mogollon people carved thousands of petroglyphs on the rock outcroppings near White Sands, making Three Rivers a significant petroglyph site.”
5. “Kiva at Pueblo Bonito” / “All Roads Lead to Chaco”
6. Long House, huge Anasazi cliff dwelling, Wetheril Mesa, Mesa Verde National Park, Colorado.
7. Puerco ruin, occupied from 1100 to 1400, Petrified Forest National Park, Arizona.
